### **Pastor's Report**

Our church meets four times every year to review various reports and affirm the work of our committees and ministry teams. These meetings do not last very long, but they give the church a chance to celebrate what God has done and is doing through His church called Parkview. Our next quarterly business meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, April 26, 2023, following our midweek worship service. Our bylaws require that the church vote on the acceptance of minutes, membership report, and financial statements. Please review these materials prior to the meeting and contact the church office if you have any questions. You will have an opportunity to ask questions during the meeting.

In addition to these reports, we will also be presenting material for your review regarding proposed bylaw and constitution changes. We will not be voting on these changes just yet. We have been thinking through the necessity of such changes and will provide details in the weeks to come. Eventually, the Guidelines to Faith and Practice Committee will present recommendations for your approval. I have included in the packet a summary of the changes that we feel need to be made in order to align our governing documents with our current operations and position us to better utilize the giftedness of those whom God strategically places in membership. I expect that within a few weeks we will be in a position to distribute, discuss and eventually vote on the details of the changes.

I want to make sure that every report includes my gratitude toward every person who is engaged with the work here at Parkview. I love the fact that we have people who have invested decades of their lives in the work of the kingdom through their involvement at Parkview, and at the same time, we have people who are just starting their faith journey with us. It really is an army of volunteers who make corporate life at Parkview possible. Easter Sunday was a logistical success because of our volunteer base. We'll trust that the harvest that comes from a faithfulness to the gospel in song, prayer, and sermon will be evident in the weeks to come. Thank you for serving the 700+ people who were on our campus on Easter Sunday.

Our prayer is that God has found us faithful with the gospel that He has entrusted to us. We are grateful that He continues to send people to become a part of our church family. We never want to take church membership or adding new members for granted. Please be intentional about watching our announcement screens in the worship and welcome centers, as well as our social media pages, as we announce the addition of new members to our church. Covenanting with a church for the purpose of the Great Commission is a big deal. I hope you will welcome our new members accordingly.

Our church attendance for the first quarter of 2023 is up about 40% over the average church attendance of the same period last year. That number reflects incredible growth. I am excited to see that growth translate into growth in our small groups as well. We still believe that sustained growth in the church will come when our members study the Bible together in small groups. We want to continue to start new groups this year. If you have never been involved in a Life Group, I want to encourage you to reach out to us and let us help you get connected. We believe that the Christian life was meant to be lived in real community, one that cannot be completely fostered during the worship service only.

I am grateful for the generosity of the Parkview family. After two really encouraging months, the offerings for March were down substantially. Still, we have been able to pay an additional \$45k on debt from operating cash surplus. Building fund offerings were down in March as well. While I thought we would be below \$500k in debt at the April 30 statement, it looks like it will be May when we drop below that significant benchmark. I believe our goal of being debt free by June 2024 is aggressive, but still possible. We have exceeded our goal of \$5k for the Annie Armstrong Easter Offering for the North American Mission Board. We will look to support One More Child in May and Mission Dignity in June. I am thankful that the generosity of the people of Parkview reflects well the generosity of our Savior Jesus.

If you haven't already done so, please begin praying for the global impact that our church will make this summer as we take the gospel to the nations. We have teams going to Jamaica, Scotland, and Czech Republic. We also have a team heading to Marianna, FL to work on a conference center that will be used to encourage, equip, and call young people to gospel ministry. Pray for the safety of these teams and that they will see fruit from their labors.

Thank you all for your faithfulness to the work here at Parkview. I love my church! I hope you can say the same.

### **Proposed Constitution and Bylaw Changes**

From time to time, it is helpful for a church to look at its governing documents to make sure that they are up to date and fit the changing climate in which the church carries out its ministry. Bylaws should also be revised to conform to the operations of the church as it develops systems that improve its efficiency in its work.

Changes in the constitution require ninety-day advance notice to all members and must be approved in a called business meeting on a Sunday morning. Changes in the bylaws require thirty-day notice to the congregation and can be approved at a regularly scheduled business meeting. We need to address areas in both the constitution and bylaws.

There are two changes that I think we need to recommend to the church with regard to the constitution:

- 1) Section three identifies our statement of faith as the Baptist Faith and Message, 1963. Given the cultural and ethical climate of today, we would be wise to not only identify the Baptist Faith and Message 2000 as our statement of faith, but also to articulate with clarity that it be the guiding force behind how we interpret Scripture for the purposes of operations, policies, and procedures. We need to be clear in our Scriptural understanding of the sanctity of life, marriage, sexual identity and purity, so that policies that reflect those beliefs can be defended if challenged. Facility usage, hiring practices, and membership guidelines in churches are all under attack by the proponents of the sexual revolution. Updating the language to reflect the Baptist Faith and Message 2000 as our statement of faith will help.
- 2) Section 3 defines our church covenant. The church covenant in principle is good, but it uses some language that I believe should be updated. It seems to have come from the standard Broadman Church Covenant that is, in my opinion, overly behavior specific. I would like the covenant to reflect language of discernment, discretion, and restraint with regard to an overall understanding that the believer is to live carefully in this world, denying ungodliness and worldly lusts accordingly. Bottom line is I want to revise the language in order to be consistent in the enforcement of church discipline across a broader area of behaviors, not just the use of alcohol.

While our bylaws are long and somewhat cumbersome, most of the articles can remain intact. I would like to consider changes in at least the following sections:

- 1) Article three deals with deacons. I would like to propose that we revise the language of section 3, items 2 and 3, qualifications, and provide some clarity to item 4, process for election. I think we need to reconsider how the current bylaws interpret the 1 Timothy 3:12 passage that speaks of a "husband of one wife." I will not suggest that divorce shouldn't be considered but that it should not automatically disqualify someone.
- 2) We need to update Article five with regard to the calendar year in which our church officers serve.

3) We need to revisit Article six and provide clarity to distinguish the difference between committees that are a part of our polity and governance and ministry teams that serve the needs of our congregation. I think that the committees should continue to be nominated by the nominating committee and elected by the church, but ministry teams such as library, hospitality, bereavement, transportation, and others should not be subjected to nomination or three-year term limits. We will retain these ministry teams with updates language in the bylaws, but separate them from what I would call the governing committees such as nominating, stewardship, personnel, and faith and practice. Committees such as missions, ushers, publicity, security, wedding, and preschool coordination should be eliminated. Again, we may retain some of the language of these committees so that we don't lose sight of a need for these things, but we need to structure our bylaws in a way that reflects how we are handling operations now.

I am providing this summary because changing bylaws is a process that requires a considerable amount of time and effort. The plan is for the Guidelines to Faith and Practice committee to present actual changes in the weeks ahead, to provide a time for questions and answers if necessary, and then vote when the required time frames have been fulfilled. Thank you for your prayers and your patience as we work through this process.

### **Children's Ministry Report**

Parkview Family,

I am so thankful for the opportunity to worship and serve alongside my Parkview family. It has been exciting to see how God has already worked in and through the families of our church this year, and I can't wait to see what he will do through our summer ministry months.

In January and February, we met and ministered to about 85 families through our Upward Basketball and Cheerleading season. We were able to share the gospel with children at each practice time and with their families and friends at every Saturday morning Game Day. I am so grateful for the team of about 30 volunteers that served each week as coaches, referees, and greeters. Their time and efforts made a kingdom impact in our church and in our city. Thank you for your willingness to serve our community and share the gospel with the next generation!

On Wednesday nights, our kids have spent the last school year hiding God's Word in their hearts through Awana Clubs. They have worked hard to memorize scripture and learned how to apply those words to their lives. We are going to celebrate those efforts and kick off our summer on Wednesday night, May 24. Our Preschool and Children's Ministries will continue to meet on campus each Wednesday night in June from 5:45-7:00pm, but in July we will be meeting off campus at a different home each week. On Sunday mornings, our preschool and children's Life Groups are continuing a chronological study through the Bible with the Gospel Project for Kids. Over the next few months, we will be studying through the life and ministry of Jesus in the gospels. Our preschool and children's ministries have seen some incredible growth on Sunday mornings over the last few months, and that means we need our ministry team to grow as well. If you think God may be calling you to teach or serve in our Next Generation Ministries, let me know so we can start a conversation about it.

Vacation Bible School is about two months away and preparations for that have already started. VBS will be June 26 - 30 from 9am – 12pm, for children that have completed Kindergarten through 5<sup>th</sup> grade. Our theme this year is Twists & Turns and our children will be learning that following Jesus changes the game. In July, we will be taking our 3<sup>rd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> graders to Super Summer Kids at Lake Yale Baptist Conference Center. This camp is three nights and four days on July 17-20, and we have already filled our 24 spots that we have registered for. It's not too late for us to increase that number, but it will be soon, so let me know and sign your kids up now if you want them to join us. Camp is a great discipleship opportunity for our children as they step out of their regular routines and focus on the truths of God's Word. Super Summer Kids is one of my family's favorite weeks of the year and I can't wait to see how God works in the lives of our children.
