Sharing Jesus without Freaking Out Understanding the Message 1 Corinthians 15:1-4

Many people are genuinely afraid of public speaking. They fear the reaction of the crowd. They fear their failure to adequately communicate their message. They fear embarrassment. When we equate sharing Jesus with public speaking, we become reluctant to share for fear of failing God. It becomes easier to share Jesus when we realize evangelism is not about public speaking. Evangelism is about conversation.

The gospel is not a list of propositional truths to be memorized. The gospel is a story that happens to us. We find it easy to converse about our day, our weather, and our sports experiences because those things are a part of everyday life. We should find it just as easy to talk about Jesus, but only if He, too, is a part of everyday life.

Reflection

Consider the number of gospel conversation you have on a regular basis. If you cannot recall that last gospel conversation you had, consider the various reasons why. If it is fear or indifference, pray for boldness and urgency. If it is because all your friends are believers, pray for opportunities. Take some time to remember and rehearse the gospel paying particular attention to how it fits into your story.
