Ultimately, a correct understanding of the nature and character of Christ will require faith. Only by faith will we be able to say that Jesus was fully God and fully man. Only by faith will we be able to declare Jesus as Savior and submit to Jesus as Lord.

Reflection

How do we live in the tension of being citizens of a kingdom that is not of this world and living in bodies that reside here? How do we resolve the tension between Jesus being fully God and fully man? How do we resolve the tension between the sovereignty of God in salvation and the free will of man? The tensions exist because in a fallen world that is the best we can do. Fortunately God does not require us to resolve the tensions before we enter His kingdom. He only requires that we have faith.
