Hebrews: The Complete Work of Christ Jesus Is Better Hebrews 1:4-14

When we meet someone for the first time, we often engage in what is known as small talk. We talk about current news, sports, or weather in order to find some common ground or interest upon which further conversation can be built. We may ask about a person's family or take an interest in their work. We may know much about a person from a twenty-minute conversation, but one thing is for sure, we won't know the person. Getting to know someone takes time.

- 1. Jesus has a unique name from the Father.
- 2. Jesus has a unique relationship to the Father.
- 3. Jesus has a unique anointing from the Father.
- 4. Jesus has a unique nature with the Father.
- 5. Jesus has a unique position near the Father.

God the Father has given Jesus Christ the Son a name greater than all names and the throne to a kingdom that has no end. All things have been created by the Son and through the Son—including angels—for the worship and service of the Son. We are confident that angels are agents of God's throne sent out for the purpose of engaging in spiritual warfare in partnership with the church. Angels are remarkable, but they pale in comparison to the glory of the Redeemer, the Son of God, Jesus Christ. Jesus is better.
