Hebrews: The Complete Work of Christ To Christ Be Glory Hebrews 13:18-25

The word doxology comes from a Greek word that means glory. We usually think of a doxology in terms of something written or sung. If we are not careful, our busyness may cause us to relegate the revelation and exaltation of God's glory to these devices. But believers are called to make their lives doxologies to God. Our daily obedience to Christ that brings glory to God and His redemptive plan is the worship God seeks.

- 1. Let's glorify Christ through the gospel.
- 2. Let's glorify Christ through our worship.
- 3. Let's glorify Christ through our church.

Listen to Jesus' prayer for us in John 17:21-22, "that they (talking about us) all may be one in us, that the world may believe that You sent me. And the glory which you gave me I have given them . . ." He has shown us His glory so that we may glorify Him through the proclamation of His gospel with our words and the demonstration of His gospel with our lives.
