The Ten Commandments Honoring Our Parents Exodus 20:12

A brief look back at history will show that totalitarian regimes exert control over people by attempting to sever the basic unit of every society—the family. They will attempt to make allegiance to the state the building block of society rather than the honoring of parents. The fifth commandment serves to remind us that in God's economy, the family plays an enormously important and incomparable role.

1. Honor extends beyond biology.

- 2. Honor bears the good with the bad.
- 3. Honor teaches us to live in community.

Most of us have heard from our parents the most simplistic rationale for obedience, "Because I said so!" How much more influence should "Because God said so!" have on our willingness to obey? In the end we need to recognize that there are spiritual reasons that God commands us to treat our parents with respect and deference, to assign them value and to treat them accordingly. Failure to do so inhibits our ability to assign proper value to our heavenly Father and may cause us to miss out on what it means to be a part of the family of God.
