The Ten Commandments When the Vow Breaks Exodus 20:14

We live in a highly sexualized culture that has basically dismissed any biblical claim to a moral order regarding intimacy between two people. That culture hasn't just seeped into the church, it has taken the church by storm. Denominations are splitting over LGBT issues because there are some who want to fully embrace the movement and others who are committed to standing firm in a biblical understanding marriage between a biological man and a biological woman.

1. God takes the marriage covenant seriously.

The gospel intends to cleanse our hands and purify our hearts to the point where we are able to ask God to help us love Him more today than we did yesterday and to love our neighbors more today than we did yesterday. By God's grace and the power of a renewed heart and born again spirit, we are able to not only not indulge lust, but we can actively seek through the sharing of that gospel the restoration of the dignity of those who have suffered from the consequences of lustful desires.
