Only as we walk in communion with Him can we ever hope to understand His desire and will for us. God has condescended (humbled) Himself to live the perfect life on our behalf and defeat the death we all deserve. What He has done, He has done plainly. The kingdom awaits those who have placed their trust not in what Christ may do, but in what Christ has already done.
