What Is the Gospel? Jesus the Savior 2 Corinthians 5:11 – 6:2

Procrastination leads us to put off until tomorrow that which we should be doing today. We tend to think that we have more time than we really have and when we begin to realize we don't, we rationalize our procrastination by convincing ourselves that we work better under pressure. We learn procrastination at a very early age when at school we are given an assignment that has a future due date. At work we have deadlines that we always seem to cozy up next to.

Main Idea: For He made Him who knew no sin to be sin for us, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him.

- 1. The nature of Christ convinces us to persuade others.
- 2. The love of Christ compels us to live for Christ.
- 3. The work of Christ calls us to conversion.

Life is full of choices. But God does not leave us without direction for such choices. Instead, He gives us priorities that make the way clear. Every believer is Christ's ambassador. Thus, everything we do and say reflects positively or negatively on Him. We should pray that the Lord will give us the grace to respond to the urgency of the gospel the way Paul did. Then perhaps we can faithfully represent Christ in the words we say, the things we do and the choices we make each day.
