Pastor's Report

Our church meets four times every year to review various reports and affirm the work of our committees and ministry teams. These meetings do not last very long, but they give the church a chance to celebrate what God has done and is doing through His church called Parkview. Our next quarterly business meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, April 24, 2024, following our midweek worship service. Our bylaws require that the church vote on the acceptance of minutes, membership report, financial statements, and other motions for consideration. Please review these materials prior to the meeting and contact the church office if you have any questions. You will have an opportunity to ask questions during the meeting.

I have really enjoyed this season of ministry at Parkview. There seems to be a renewed focus and reliance on the Holy Spirit as we have studied the book of Acts together. It has been wonderful to see the response of our church family to the challenges to have gospel conversations and to see a sense of urgency with regard to baptism. Easter was a great day with well over 700 people on the campus. The week after was just as exciting as we baptized five people and observed communion together. Even after a long service, seeing everyone after church hanging around, engaging in conversation, and not trying to leave right away just seemed right and good. I love this church family and the work we get to do together for the glory of Christ and His kingdom.

Our NEXT class continues to be an excellent resource for people who are wanting to join our church. Not only do we outline the gospel and the expectations of church membership, we are able to talk through the different on-ramps that we provide to help people engage in the life of the church at whatever level is comfortable for them. Many of you have noticed that we are posting pictures of our newest family members in the worship center and online. In both cases, thank you for reaching out to them and making them feel like they are an integral part of our church family.

Speaking of on-ramps, the best way to get assimilated into the life of the church is through our Life Groups. These groups meet on a weekly basis to pray for one another, study the Scriptures together, and care for one another. They are led by some of the best Bible teachers in the area. If you haven't yet gotten connected to a Life Group, please reach out to me and I will help you find a group that I think will help you grow in grace and care well for you.

I continue to be amazed and encouraged by the generosity of our church members. We have had a goal of being debt free by June 2024 and I am happy to announce that as of Sunday, April 21, 2024, we are indeed debt free! Thank you Parkview family for your dedication to the gospel and for your faithfulness to find ways to impress that gospel on the hearts and minds of the Next Generation. We are finished with the debt on our building, but we have some maintenance and other projects that we still need to accomplish. We need to outfit our buildings with new roofs and renovate the bathroom and kitchen area of our fellowship hall. I trust that you will continue to contribute to the building fund in order to accomplish these projects without having to take on new debt.

Several weeks ago, we announced that our student pastor, JonSeth Sammons, will be leaving Parkview to plant and pastor a new church in Crestview, FL. We are working through the North American Mission Board and utilizing some of the resources they offer to help make the launch of Grove Church Crestview successful. JonSeth has been given a green light by the NAMB assessment team which means he will begin a one-year residency here at Parkview. In June 2025, JonSeth and his family will move to Crestview to begin the logistical and hands-on work of starting a church. In the meantime, JonSeth will continue to serve as Parkview's student pastor.

Right now, Grove Church Crestview is a concept in our hearts and minds that needs the full attention of our prayers. We are the sending church and as such we are committed to partnering with JonSeth and the core group of people who will move to Crestview to begin a new work there. We are committed to praying for them, supporting them at what is right now an undetermined level of financial support, and helping them get established administratively. We will keep Grove Church Crestview and the Sammons family at the forefront of our prayers. We need you to pray also for our students and Parkview's student ministry, that it will remain strong, cohesive, and dedicated to following Jesus during this time of transition.

We have well over fifty people participating in four different trips this year: North Carolina, Budapest, Scotland, and Jamaica. We will take some time in upcoming worship services to commission and pray for each of these teams. We also have several members of our church who even though they cannot go, are giving sacrificially to financially support the various teams. As a church, we will continue to pray, give, and go until the Lord returns.

One describes the activities of our Women's Missions and Ministries groups. The other describes some of the ways Parkview has prioritized a wholistic approach to spiritual formation through activities related to Parkview Fitness. Once again, thank you for your involvement, your commitment, your sacrifice, your generosity, and your love for Jesus. It is a joy and honor to be able to serve with you as co-laborers in Christ for the expansion and glory of His kingdom.

Children's Ministry Report

Parkview Family,

I am so thankful for the opportunity for my family to serve alongside our Parkview family. I love to see God working in the lives of our children, students, and families, and I can't wait to see what He does through our summer months of ministry. Join me in praising God for what He has done these last few months, and in praying for God to save the lost and transform lives through our VBS, camps, mission trips, and weekly discipleship opportunities coming up this summer.

In January and February, we had an outstanding season of ministry through Upward Basketball and Cheerleading. Our coaches, referees, and greeters served well and connected with families from our community. We were able to share the gospel every week with 95 kids at practices and more than 400 people every Saturday morning. Only 14 of those kids involved in our league this season were a part of our Parkview family. There is no other ministry at Parkview that brings unchurched people from our community onto our campus to hear the gospel in this way. Sports ministry provides the opportunity for our church family to develop real relationships and friendships over the eight-week season for the purpose of gospel conversations and church invitations. I hope you will thank our coaches, refs, and volunteers that served faithfully for January and February, and I hope that you will pray about how you might be involved in this ministry next year.

Sunday mornings and Wednesday nights continue to be exciting and fruitful ministry opportunities. I love to see and hear how our Parkview Kids are learning and growing in their walk with Christ. Our Life Group and Awana leaders are doing an outstanding job faithfully teaching the truth of the gospel to our children and we continue to see the fruit of those efforts. We have 8 children currently working through the process of preparing for baptism with their families. Join me in praying for them (including Emma!) and their parents as we seek to disciple our children well.

Vacation Bible School is coming up soon and preparations are well underway! VBS will be June 10 - 14 from 9am – 12pm, for children that have completed Kindergarten through 5th grade. This is a different week this year, but this change will make it possible for the students and leaders that will be on mission in Budapest with JonSeth and me later in the month to serve here during VBS. Our theme this year is Breaker Rock Beach, and our kids will be learning the truths found in Romans 12:2, "Do not be conformed to this age, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, so that you may discern what is the good, pleasing, and perfect will of God." Join me in praying that our kids would be transformed by the truth of the gospel this week! In July, we will be taking our 3rd-5th graders to Super Summer Kids at Lake Yale Baptist Conference Center. This camp is three nights and four days on July 15-18, and it's not too late for your child to join us, but it will be soon. Women's Missions and Ministries Report of 2023 Activities

Parkview has a long history of women's involvement in missions and ministries through the Women's Missionary Union (WMU), an auxiliary of the Southern Baptist Convention. For decades, women's mission groups have met monthly to pray and participate in local ministry efforts. Parkview women have been actively helping others in the name of Jesus and remain "on mission" at home and around the world. In 2023, that mission continued to be "to inspire other believers to influence their world for Christ."

Women's Ministries at Parkview - In 2023, there were three mission groups at Parkview: the Mathis Group, the Sharon Group, and the re-emerging P-31 Group. The Missions Mosaic magazine provided Prayer Calendars as well as interesting, informative articles, and personal stories about Southern Baptist missionaries around the world. At each meeting, members prayed specifically for each missionary whose birthday was that day. Mission groups in many other Southern Baptist churches were praying for them as well. Missionaries often report how impactful these birthday prayers have been in their lives.

Mathis Mission Group met at 10:00 a.m., the second Tuesday morning of each month. Most meetings were in the Adult IV classroom. Betty Lawhon led the group. After a time of prayer for missionaries, led by Vicky Estepp, they discussed articles of interest in Missions Mosaic. Members wrote notes or cards to sick and homebound members and made visits to church members in nursing homes or at home. They used their offering funds to benefit mission offerings and home mission efforts. These six wisdom-filled ladies occasionally participated in Sharon Mission Group activities. They welcome new members!

Sharon Mission Group met at 6:00 p.m., the second Monday evening of each month in the Fellowship Hall. This group of 65 members was led by Gail Hartzog. Meeting attendance averaged 25 to 40 ladies.

Jayne Floyd led the Missionary Prayer Calendar at the meetings. Each month, the program focused on a different ministry opportunity, planned and organized by a small committee. In 2023, the members of Sharon Mission Group provided items needed by the Pregnancy Care Center, Another Way (local women's shelter), Lad Soup Kitchen, and the Christian Service Center. In November, they hosted a holiday party for the residents at the CARC Group Home. At Christmas, they also delivered home-baked goods and desserts to veterans at the VA Domiciliary and the VA Nursing Home. The group sent Valentines to homebound and nursing home residents and flowers and candy to homebound Parkview members. The group led the annual WorldCrafts market of handcrafted items, a church-wide project to support women rescued from trafficking and poverty across the world. The group also supported Operation Christmas Child by helping Bonnie Mosby prepare items for 56 shoeboxes packed by Parkview's K-6* grade children. Vickie Steward led the Bread & Jam Gift Bag welcome ministry. She delivered a gift bag to each woman who became a new member at Parkview. Bags included a tea towel, a potholder, bread, jam, devotional items, and information about Parkview's women's ministries.

Special Visit from Cindy Bradley: Cindy Bradley, Director of Women's Ministries and Education for Florida Baptist Convention, was a guest at the September meeting, which included the annual WorldCrafts Celebration. Then, in November, the WorldCrafts Celebration was featured in the Florida Baptist online newsletter flbaptist.org with photos and an article by journalist David Moore.

P-31 Mission Group: Parkview's younger women's mission group was in a re-organization phase last year. Hopefully, new things are in store this year. Stay tuned to hear more about this group.
